教學方式 Instructional Method	This class will be held in English. Each student is strongly encouraged to be well prepared in reading assigned materials before participating classes every week and to make substantive intellectual contribution to class discussion or dialogue. Students will be randomly called on answering questions, expressing ideas or briefing the main theme of assigned readings and cases. Failing to follow the rules will be subject to penalties either to deduct the grade or to submit a written paper on the topic concerned.
課程要求 Course Requirements	Grading will be based 20% on class participation and discussion, 40% on submission of five reaction papers on relevant topics, and 40% on an in-class presentation of an assigned or self-selected WTO case together with a completion of term paper. The paper should be an original work based on the assigned or selected WTO case in compliance with appropriate citation rules.
評量方式 Evaluation	Grading will be based 20% on class participation and discussion, 40% on submission of five reaction papers on relevant topics, and 40% on an in-class presentation of an assigned or self-selected WTO case together with a completion of term paper. The paper should be an original work based on the assigned or selected WTO case in compliance with appropriate citation rules.
